Personal statements:

Professor Mark Bailey

I serve on the Manorial Documents Advisory Group, and have a wide interest in the agrarian, economic and social history of late-medieval England.

Dr John Broad

I have previously served the Society as Secretary, Chair of Executive Committee, and President. My interests are particularly in the early modern rural history of England, across a spectrum including rural housing, poverty and welfare, the Land Tax and Social Structure, Royal Forests.

Dr Jordan Claridge

My research interests are in the rural history of England in the Middle Ages, particularly in horse power, real wages and entrepreneurialism in the dairy industry after the Black Death.

Dr Rebecca Ford

I am an historical/cultural geographer with a strong interest in rural history. With a background in the geographies of horticulture and market-gardening, I am now extending my research interests to include agrarian manuscripts. A longstanding member of the BAHS, I became the editor of 'Rural History Today' in 2018. I continue to work to broaden the range and diversity of its content and its contributors, as well as to build its readership.

Dr Susan Kilby

My principal interest is in the complexity of peasants' relationships with the landscape in the later medieval period.

Prof. John Martin

My research has focused mainly on the issue of UK food security - one of the recognized 'Grand Challenges' for the international research community. In addition to my research publications I have acted as the series consultant and contributor for BBC's 8-part living history 'Wartime Farm' series.

Dr Jean Morrin

I previously lectured at the University of Winchester and served on the Executive Committee of BAHS. Secretary, Southern History Society 2004-14. Past research interests have been the estates of ecclesiastical institutions (Durham Cathedral, St Pauls Cathedral) and I am

currently leading groups researching and writing the local history of Hampshire communities for the Victoria County History

Derek Shepherd

I am an agricultural economist who at one point worked for the NFU and then for many years taught at Seale-Hayne Agricultural College/University of Plymouth. I have also been Treasurer of the Agricultural Economics Society since 2006.

Professor Annie Tindley

Over the past decade or more, I have published and edited significant contributions to our understanding of rural life, especially landed estates in Scotland, Ireland and England, and have written extensively on the modern politics of the land, and land reform, especially in Scotland.

Prof. Abigail Woods

Reflecting her earlier career as a veterinary surgeon, Abigail's research focuses on the history of animals, animal health, livestock agriculture, and the zoological aspects of human medicine.
